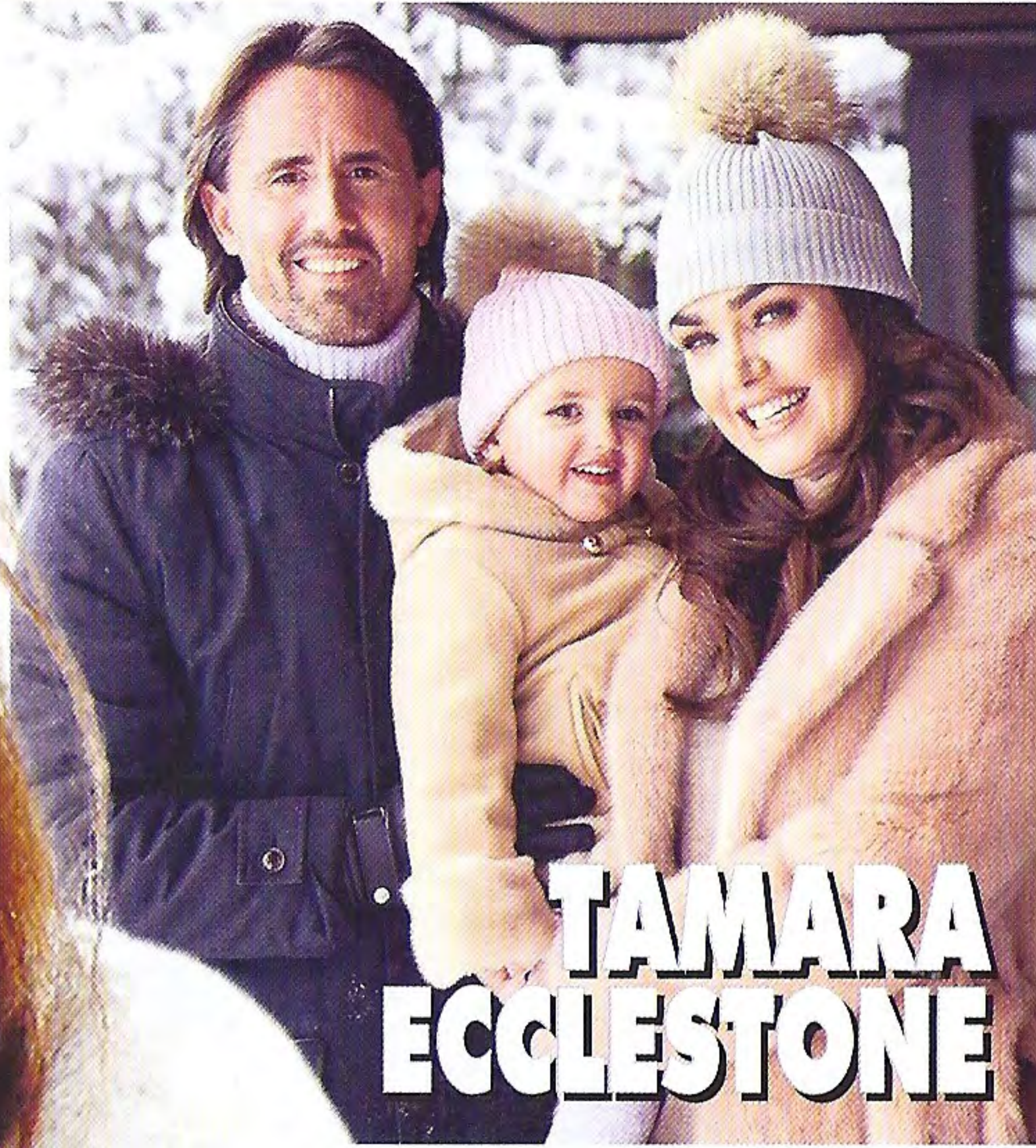

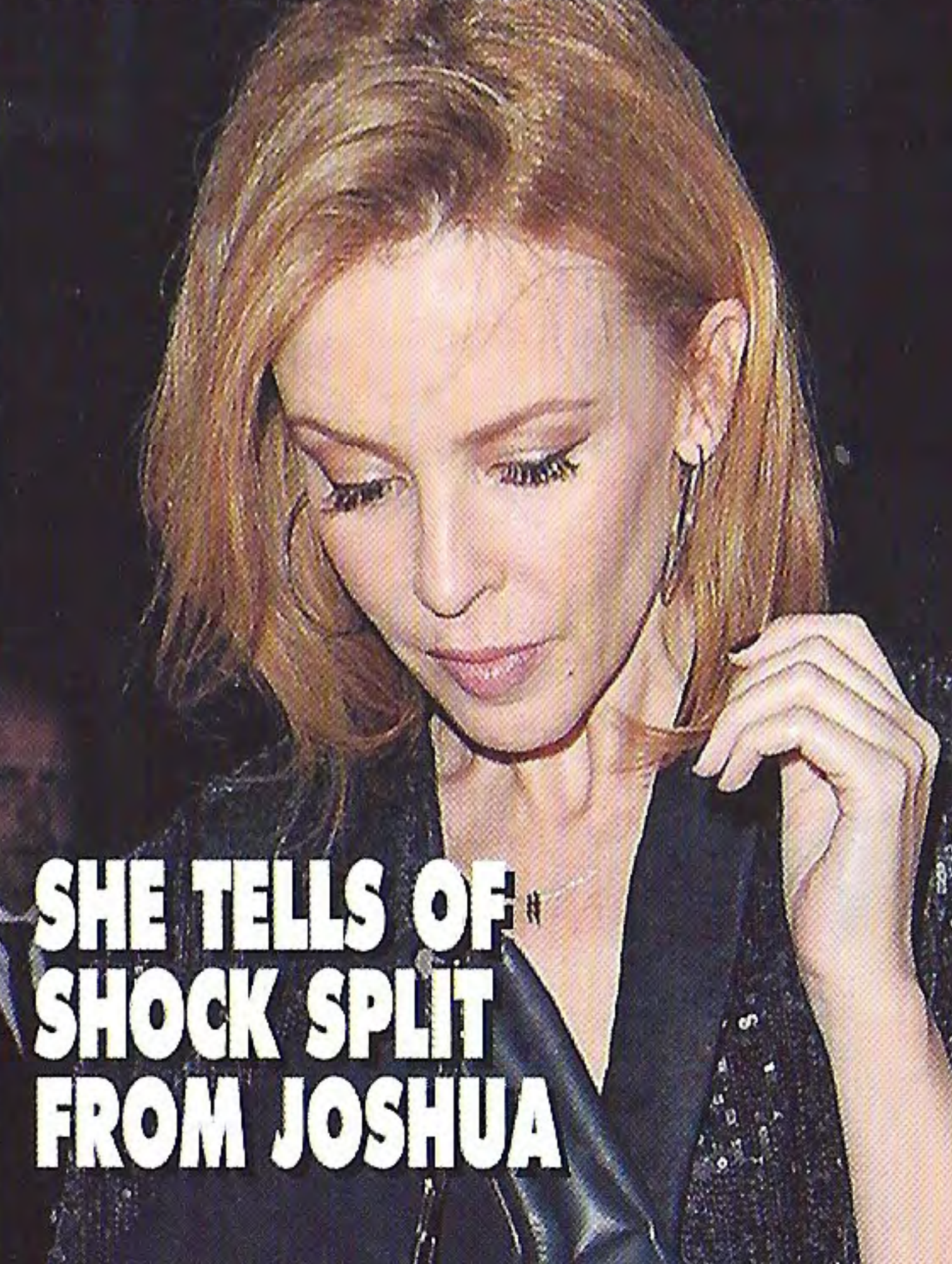

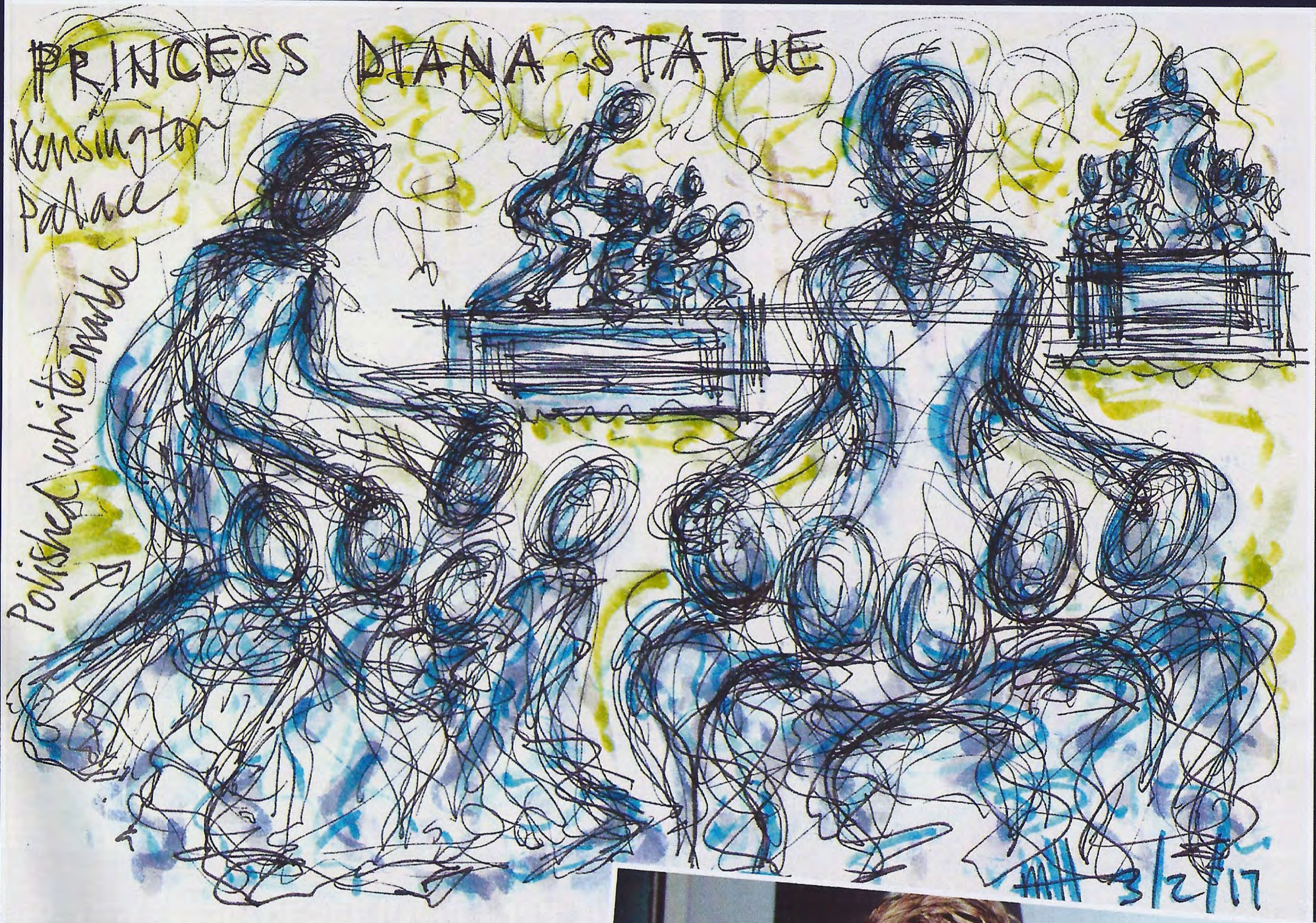

# PRINCES WILLIAM AND HARRY UNITE TO CARVE THEIR MOTHER'S MEMORY IN STONE



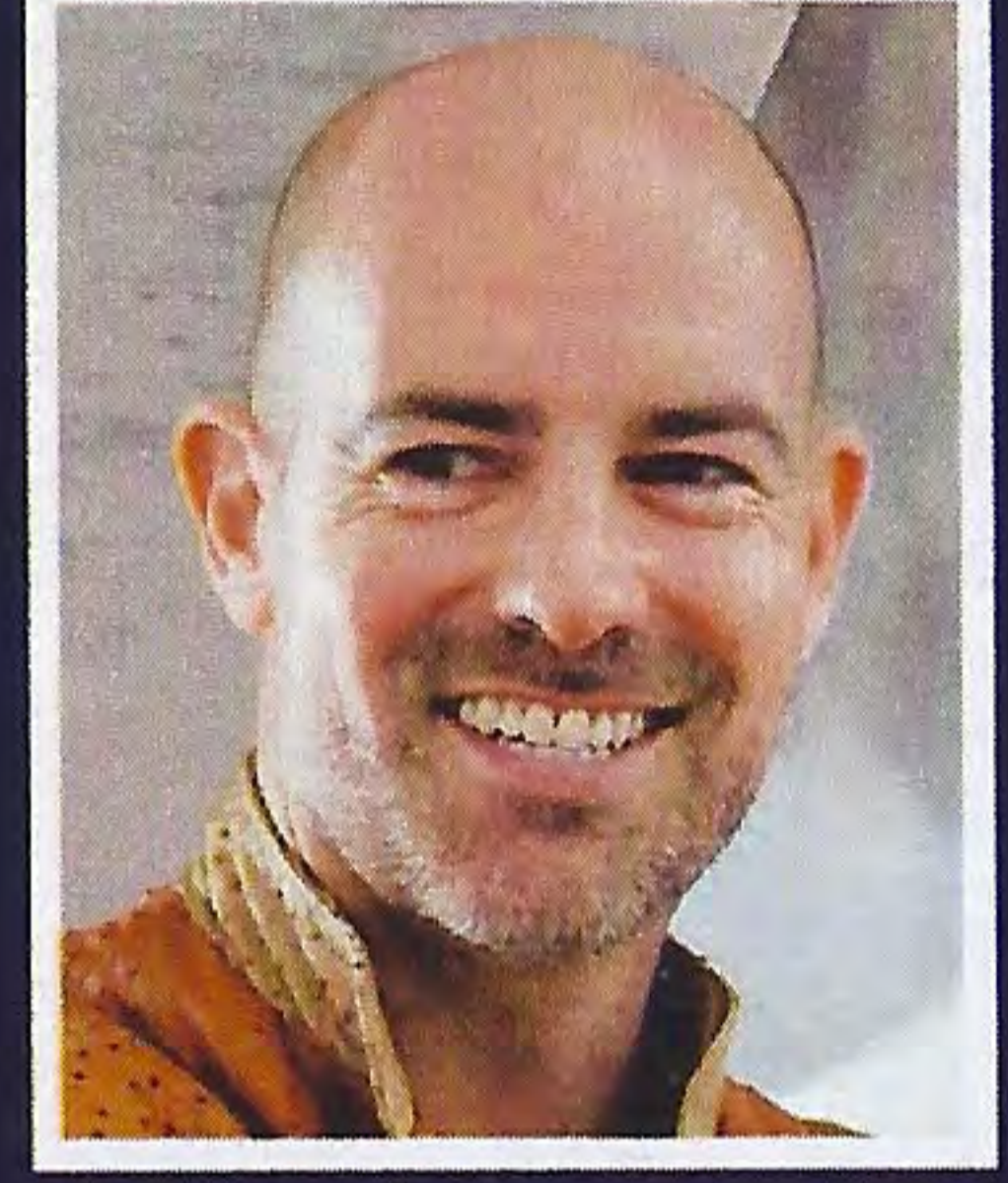

She was their beloved mother, who's still in their thoughts every day. So it is fitting that the Duke of Cambridge and Prince Harry should want to keep the memory of Diana, Princess of Wales burning bright. And the 20th anniversary of her death this August is the perfect occasion to ensure she is not forgotten.

The Princes have announced that they are planning a public memorial to Princess Diana in the form of a statue. It will stand in the public gardens at Kensington Palace, the London home she shared with the two boys until her death, and they will be able to see it from their apartments.

Prince William and Harry said in a joint statement: "It has been 20 years since our mother's death and the time is right to recognise her positive impact in the UK and around the world with a permanent statue. Our mother touched so many lives. We hope the statue will help all those who visit Kensington Palace to reflect on her life and legacy."

"I think it's a timeless piece, which embodies her, and I think the idea would appeal to many spectators.

"It's a quick idea of what I think is fitting for our country, the Palace and the Princes. I also think she would like it."

Sculptor, artist and photographer David Cornell, who has created more official portraits of the British royal family than any other sculptor, sent us sketches of his designs for a full-length statue and a bust.

"I wanted to create something dignified," he tells us. "She often used to put her hand on her heart in photographs. She used to love to dance and wear long evening gowns but I didn't put her in a specific dress. A statue needs to be timeless."

**INSPIRING IDEAS**

While an artist has yet to be chosen to create the statue, HELLO! invited sculptors Mark Humphreys and David Cornell to send us sketches of their ideas.

Mark – who last year met the Duke of York when he unveiled his piece marking the Battle of Jutland centenary, and the Princess Royal as she unveiled his poppy statue at Royal Wootton Bassett – depicts Diana as the People's Princess, sculpted in white marble.

"The way I think of her, it would be the only material fitting. It's my interpretation of her as serene and graceful," he tells HELLO!. "She's leaning
